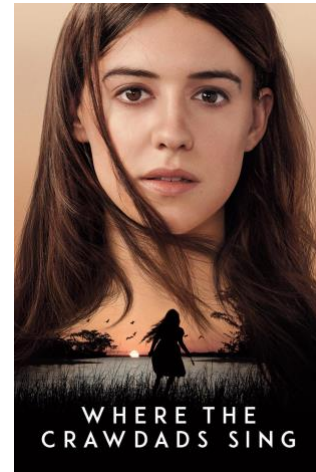


## The Biggest Films Of The Year Are Available To Watch At Home In September
